





## Consider Old Salem Church

Old Salem Shrine, known locally as the "Little White Church," has resonated with couples pledging or reaffirming their vows for generations. We invite you to create your own special memories of sharing your vows and exchanging rings embraced by family and friends in the intimacy of historic Old Salem Shrine.

Old Salem is nestled among mature trees along the shores of Schmidt Lake in Inver Grove Heights. The historic site makes a picturesque setting for celebrations of up to 50 guests or an intimate live-streamed ceremony.

Provide your own officiant or work with one we recommend. You may play recorded music or hire an organist experienced in using the church's antique pump organ.



### A Simpler Time

Old Salem Shrine captures the local color of rural Dakota County in the late 1800s and early 1900s as well a sense of the pioneers' heritage and steadfast faith in God.

Generations of volunteer trustees have taken great care to preserve the church as it was when the last regular Sunday service was held around 1913.

The current building, built around 1875, measures 20'6" x 32' 6", has a hall or tower entrance of 5' x 7', and measures 14' from the stone founda-

tion to the eaves, with a tower of approximately 30'.

Many of the interior elements are original or of the period, including the potbelly wood-burning stove, wooden pews, and the vintage organ powered by foot pedals.

The upkeep of the historic building is funded entirely through donations and bequests, and modest rental fees for weddings and special events.
